

Representative Cases for Troy Roe, Esq.

Personal Injury - Products Liability

Plaintiff suffered major burns as a result of a valve failure. Defendants argued misuse of the product caused the burns. Settlement: \$2.3 million.

Medical Malpractice

Plaintiff suffered shoulder injury (Erb's palsy) during delivery (dystocia). Significant loss of use of upper extremity. Defendants argued little or no economic damages. Settlement: \$500,000.

Plaintiff suffered birth injuries due to Defendants' failure to monitor progress of labor. Brain damage. Defendants argued comparative fault as to baby's mother. Settlement: \$4.5 million.

Wrongful Death

Physician killed by on-coming, head-on collision. Defendant was passing a truck-trailer at high rate of speed. Defendant insurance company argued no principal-agency relationship at the time of the incident. Decedent survived by wife and two kids. Settlement: \$12 million.

Sexual Molestation/Government Liability:

Two minors placed in foster care by the governmental agency. Both were abused and sexually molested. Plaintiffs' guardian contends that agency did inadequate background check on foster parents. Failure to do due diligence in follow up. Notice that there was a problem in the home. Governmental agency argued no notice; background checks met the standard of care; children already had psychological damages that predated placement in the foster home; inadequate damage proof. Cases settled after two sessions of mediation for \$1 million per child.

A major motion picture star was alleged to be too permissive in supervising the star's teenage son: Wild parties, alcohol, drugs, and sex with minors, etc. Minor plaintiff alleges she was raped at a party at the

movie star's home. Claimed emotional distress. The case involved various covered and non-covered losses. In addition to insurance counsel, the star's entertainment attorney attended the mediation. The case also was complicated by Prop. 51, apportionment, damage issues. The matter was resolved at mediation, but all terms are confidential.
